Call to Order & Opening Prayer	Steve Craig called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and Father Pins led an opening prayer. Minutes from the September 11, 2025 Leadership Council were sent out electronically before the meeting. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Andrew Phillips, seconded by Jennifer Tracey and then unanimously approved.	Call to Order and Opening Prayer. Minutes of the September 11, 2025 meeting were unanimously approved.
Teacher Presentation	Student Resource Teachers: Micki Alsin, Kasey Eoriatti, Sara Doyle and Lynda McLuen presented the following:  • The teachers are currently looking over the FAST data and tiering students into three tiers. Tier 1- all students will receive universal instruction. Tier 2 - there is some risk and therefore they might pull kids into a WIN group or teachers may help students through resources they provide. Tier 3 - High	Presentation by Student Resource Teachers.

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Open Forum	Risk - students are monitored throughout the year and pulled for additional individual instruction. 70 students in reading and 70 students in math fall into Tier 2 or Tier 3. Kids can flex in and out as needed but typically Tier 2 and Tier 3 students score below the 40th percentile nationally.  • PANORAMA is a new software to look at data connected to FAST Bridge that allows the teachers to take data from FAST and look at the student as a whole. For instance, attendance, performance in other classes, and behavioral components are looked at to see if these factors are supporting or impeding their success. The Diocese asks resource teachers to track these students so they can monitor progress more closely. PANORAMA also tracks infractions from a disciplinary standpoint. This is a newer program- they were just trained by Ann Franklin from the Diocese and they feel very supported.  • Resource teachers also participate on the SIT committee. SIT- Student Intervention Team includes a behavior interventionist, nurse, counselors, and Vice Principal. The SIT committee meets weekly to discuss students and problem solve about specific students. This includes giving teachers ideas of interventions, plans, check-ins and then follow up as needed. If a student has a 504, they assist teachers with modifying or helping with accommodations. Currently SFA School has 47 students on a 504 plan.

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	forward. Questions arose- A motion was made to look into any other options and discuss at the next meeting. Motion made by William Downs, seconded by Michael Perrin, and unanimously approved.  Film glass coverings on every school window and door (\$27,400). The main school and church entrances and the arch window in the church have been completed. Covering every first-floor school door and window will cost \$27,400. Installation would start over spring break and finish over the summer. Motion made to approve this expenditure now using surplus funds by Michael Perrin, seconded by Bailey Panzi and unanimously approved.  Key fobs (\$4,500) - The delivery door is unlocked when items are being delivered. This would reduce the risk when items are being delivered. Motion to approve this expenditure made by Michael Perrin, seconded by Bailey Panzi and unanimously approved.  ESL education (\$3,500) Last year we had 3 students and this year we have 13 in the program. Our teacher will complete certification after 1 more year. This is a program that is needed. Dr. Bishop said this expense could be funded through a Diocese account. Mr. Lynch will follow up with Dr. Bishop on that expense.	Jeff Lynch will look into other AI security options and will arrange for a presentation on the best option at the next LC meeting.  Council approved using \$27,400 in LC Account funds to purchase protective coverings for all 1st floor school windows and doors (to be installed this spring-summer).  Council approved using \$4500 in LC Account funds to purchase a new key fob system to be installed on the school delivery door.  Jeff Lynch will follow up with Dr. Bishop to secure diocesan funding for ESL certification training for our current ESL instructor.

Pastoral Report	<ul> <li>Father Pins presented the following information:</li> <li>Confirmation will be with Bishop Joensen on Sunday October 26th.</li> <li>All Saints and All Souls Day will be celebrated soon and 5th graders will do their Saints Projects that week.</li> <li>The Capital Campaign was announced to the parish last weekend. Part of the messaging of this campaign includes the importance of our faith and that Jesus calls us to do as St. Francis and "Rebuild my Church." Francis fixed up the physical aspects (brick and mortar) of a few churches but soon realized rebuilding the church also involved getting people to live out their faith and to spread God's word. A new preschool, a new adoration chapel, and new meeting rooms and kitchen upgrades are all part of the Capital Campaign. 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Report from SFA School Principal & Vice Principal	<ul> <li>Jeff Lynch presented the following information:</li> <li>Did team building at Camp Dodge and the goal of getting them together and working closely together was accomplished.</li> <li>Dowling Football team and cheerleaders will be greeting families at morning carline tomorrow.</li> <li>Conferences are quickly approaching and the Book Fair is up and running.</li> <li>Jodi Halligan presented the following information.</li> <li>A data dive occurs 3 times a year using FAST assessment results where they look at what we need as a building. Data shows that our students are very proficient. Jodi is encouraging teachers to consider this question: <ol> <li>What will we do when they already know it? The teachers broke into PLC small groups and decided to look at WIN time and moving kids around as needed.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Donna Bishop presented the following information: <ol> <li>Dr. Bishop continues to develop long range plans for the diocesan school system and wants to be helpful to the school boards.</li> <li>What does the future look like? St Francis and a few other schools are at capacity. Early Childhood Education is a passion and is encouraged at all parishes. St. Boniface may start an Early Childhood program. Looking at other parishes that might have the capability of adding a school. Also, they are exploring the possibility of a second high school in Ankeny.</li> <li>NESBECS standards are best practices for Catholic Schools across the country. The DM Diocese wants to fulfill and surpass those standards. Teams from the diocese will visit schools to tour the schools + do on-site interviews. The team recently visited St. Luke's and looked at all four NESBECS domains and how to excel in each area.</li> <li>Dr. Bishop reported she is encouraged by the way we are meeting students where they are. DM diocesan schools have shown 6 years of consecutive growth. It is an exciting time to be involved.
