May sell candles after masses in January and at the upcoming All School Mass. • Sponsorship sale of one parking spot has been sold. • Floral and printing costs are being sponsored this year. • Working on budget - secured a lot of unique and fun experiences and gifts. <p>Jessica Hull presented the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Budget breakout down to specific items provided. Analyzed last year's expenses and identified areas they could consolidate. This includes having vendors take on multiple roles. • 3 Sponsorships- 1 for desserts, 1 for printing and 1 for florals arranged. • Will continue to drive interest with candles (currently a profit) and out of uniform passes have already made approximately \$2000. • Kylie has moved forward with gambling license. Tested the Square device and it did not work to just accept Debits so they will make a plan to ensure that they are only taking cash or debit for the casino and Heads or Tails. • Total sponsorship money is already over \$25,000. • Knights of Columbus will be serving the drinks again this year. • West Des Moines Police Officer will be on duty from 5:30 – 11:00 pm. • Iowa Auctioneers Council hoping to secure volunteer auctioneer. • All volunteers will be shown where the first aid kits and exits are located. Will follow up with parents via News and Notes. • November 22, 2025 6th Grade Student Family Mass – 31 students attended. • Promoting Faith Night Presentation on Safe Social Media Use: Ben Tracy on 1-14-26 at 7 pm Parish Hall. Flyers will be distributed once they are received from Ben Tracy. • The Mental Health Committee has resumed meetings – Mollie Mertens participating. 2nd Monday of every month Mental Health Mondays will be incorporated back into the school. • Quarterly Leadership Council Chairs Meeting with Regional School System Leaders held 11-19-2026. Steve Craig shared what was discussed at this meeting. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Tim Schulte discussed how tuition decisions were made for next year including a 5% tuition increase. Still hoping to get all schools on the same tuition schedule in the next 1-2 years. ○ Finnane Committee – Audit for 2024-2025 involving all seven participating schools was completed and no issues identified. ○ IT 5-year Plan for network and infrastructure updates developed. Comprehensive cyber security plan also being developed. ○ Compensation Committee in charge of determining pay and benefits for teachers and staff. Survey done in the fall and 280 teachers completed the survey- newer teachers focus more on salary and seasoned teachers focus more on retirement plan. The committee is working toward setting salaries at 95% of market average and developing a uniform retirement plan. ○ Donna Bishop shared the Catholic Schools Office Annual Report. CSO is making NSBEC site visits to each school in the region that address Mission and Catholic Identity, Governance & Leadership, Academic Excellence and Operational Vitality. Saint Francis will be visited in February 2026. • Lego League for SFA School Students – Success in Year 1! Two teams- 1 had 10 and 1 had 9 students. This time the theme was around archeology. Report from SFA School	<p>Jeff Lynch presented the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reconciliation for 3, 7, and 8 grades will happen tomorrow. • Only one family is not returning to SFA next year due to moving away. • Working on calendar for 2026-2027 that will collaborate well with Dowling and other schools in the diocese. • Three of four planned Christmas concerts completed. 5th Grade concert canceled due to weather and will be rescheduled • Met yesterday with another security company and are waiting on a bid from one other. The lock company also came in and gave a bid to reissue locks for all the doors in the school. The Auction Committee can advertise that proceeds will be used for security upgrades at the school. Final decision on which security upgrades to make still being considered. • Jeff addressed a question about Carline- are there still helpers to get kids out of the car? Yes. Volunteers are not currently being utilized. If a parent needs to pull a car over to drop off a student on the north side, they should come all the way up to the front.
