FAITH

At St. Francis of Assisi, faith formation promotes a relationship with Christ and teaches students how to live the Gospel through love and service to others. We are purposeful in including parents in school religious activities including school Masses, retreats, and Sacrament preparation. Catholic faith is the cornerstone of our school, we welcome students of all faith traditions.

- We shared a monthly newsletter with parents called *Partners in Faith*. This resource supports parents in raising faithful Catholic children. Every issue is filled with actionable ideas to build a Christ centered family life, increase the family's knowledge of the Catholic faith and grow in devotion to the sacraments.
- Students in grades K-5 celebrated May Crowning by presenting flowers at the altar to honor Mary. Middle school students brought flowers for the Mary Garden.
- Volunteerism and community outreach are a cornerstone of the Catholic faith, and our students provided 4000 hours of service throughout the local community during the 2024-2025 school year.



EXCELLENCE

St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School is fully accredited in the state of Iowa, and is a two-time Blue Ribbon School of Excellence. We challenge students to aim higher academically, spiritually and personally through faith-centered learning and a rigorous academic program aligned with state standards. Our teachers and support staff are equipped with the tools to support ALL students wherever they may be on their academic journey. Throughout the school year, we assess all students to monitor growth and provide intervention for those needing additional support or enrichment.

- Our school offered WIN time to enhance student learning. What I Need (WIN) time is a flexible period of time incorporated into the daily school schedule where extra help or enrichment opportunities are available.
- To meet the needs of diverse learners, our student support team helped improve academic achievement for all students through individualized assessment and interventions. We also offered Reading Recovery and Enrichment and Gifted Learner programs.
- We strive to incorporate new and innovative technology to enhance our curriculum and prepare students for the future. This commitment to innovation drives our 1:1 device program with Ipads in use for grades K-1 . In grades 2-8 the use of chromebooks 1/1



EXCELLENCE

St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School participates in the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP). ISASP is a standards-based assessment designed to inform schools and families on how students perform on the Iowa Core Academic Standards. Students performing at the proficient level demonstrate adequate competency in the knowledge, skills, and abilities that meet the requirements for their grade level associated with academic readiness for college and a career in the subject area.

EXCELLENCE

St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School applies the use of a standards-based evaluation tool, FASTBridge, for grades K-5 to identify student goals for learning and provide individualized student support to ensure these goals are met. This screening and early identification of student needs increases the speed of intervention and supports a building-wide multi-tiered system of supports. These assessments help teachers better understand student progress and needs. Moreover, this additional layer of data allows teachers to focus on essential skills and better track student growth.

EXCELLENCE

Students in grades 6-8 participate in the FAST assessment. This assessment measures achievement and growth in math, reading, and language usage, providing teachers with data to help inform instructional strategies and create an individualized learning experience for each student.

COMMUNITY

In 2024-2025, the St. Francis of Assisi community identified what is most unique about our school. These differentiators included parental involvement, a community committed to the faith formation and success of all students, high academic expectations supported through robust programs to meet the needs of all learners, and strong parish and school leadership.

- We prepared students to be viable members of our community through social-emotional learning. Our goal is to establish a strong foundation for each student's social-emotional development which is critical for building healthy relationships, communicating effectively,
- Students participated in a food drive for our local food pantry. They collected four large boxes of food items which were donated around Thanksgiving time.
- Middle school students were able to help 30 families from our diocese to have a Christmas with presents under their tree
- Students in 5th grade host a collection of supplies and create boxes for West Des Moines to hand out to the homeless and people in need. All grade levels contribute something different for the boxes.



VALUE

Investing in your child's education at St. Francis of Assisi is about more than a number– it's about a teaching approach that focuses on your child's mind, body and soul. It's about having the best educators with challenging lesson plans and new technologies at your disposal. It's about a creative, disciplined and welcoming environment where a focus on social justice, service and leadership is central to each student's experience. It's about your child growing and flourishing in every part of their life – not just test scores.

- In 2024-2025, We had 120 families which made 243 students recipients of ESA funding.
- Approximately 97 percent of 2024-2025 eighth-grade graduates continued their Catholic education at Dowling Catholic High School.
- Outside of the classroom, we offer extracurricular programs that provide students with an opportunity to learn teamwork, responsibility, dedication and good sportsmanship. In school year 2024-2025, students participated in various extracurricular and athletic programs including basketball, soccer, track, cross country, football, swimming, cheerleading, softball, volleyball, and wrestling.



THE COST TO EDUCATE

As a parent, your tuition investment goes towards high-caliber educators, enhanced learning experiences, the latest technology, and moral and emotional education for your child. We greatly appreciate and understand the financial sacrifice our families make to provide their children with an education at our school. However, tuition only covers a portion of the cost of educating a student at St. Francis of Assisi.


TUITION AND COST TO EDUCATE
